For those of you that couldn't attend, the intention is to remove rats, mice, and mustelids from the Normandale area. The meeting was told about how it would work and about success in other communities in the Wellington region. More about this in an upcoming newsletter.

Caring for your cats

If you own a cat, it is really important to ensure that your cat is neutered and vaccinated.

A couple of months ago, Sammy turned up on a local doorstep cold, wet, frightened and starving (see top photo). He is very affectionate and has obviously belonged to someone in the past. The vet



estimated that he was about 5 years old and had FIV.

Having FIV means his immune system does not work as it should, and he is more vulnerable to other illnesses. Sammy is now desexed, which means his illness is only transmissible by a deep bite wound from another cat. Though Sammy is a very relaxed cat, the other cats he may encounter in the neighbourhood might not be as



relaxed. Sammy now has to be kept indoors so he doesn't pass FIV to other cats. This could have been avoided if his original owners had got him neutered. He has been adopted through the Cat's Protection League (cpl-wellington.org.nz) and now has a lovely home.
