As mentioned last month there is a Christmas event for our local community to celebrate together the greatest gift ever given.


*Saturday 16th December 7pm @

## Civil defence in Normandale

December 2017

The wonderful people over at WREMO have been working hard to get the word out to communities about the Civil Defence Response. In the event of an emergency, be it a major tsunami or earthquake, Normandale may be cut off from the valley floor and will have to be self sufficient. This means that residents will have to have their own supplies and be able to coordinate themselves.

The WREMO hub activation exercise in Maungaraki walked through the things involved in operating a Civil Defence Hub in just such an event. The major takeaway that we should all be aware of is that IN AN EMERGENCY, IT IS HIGHLY LIKELY THAT NOBODY IS COMING TO HELP YOU. In addition people may be coming up from the valley to escape possible tsunami warnings.

In such an event it is important to look after yourself and your immediate neighbours first, and this means having ample supplies and a good plan in place. The civil defence hub can then be used by any of you able to give help or needing help. We will all need to coordinate our efforts to keep Normandale safe. It is likely that we will have to be self-sufficient but you should now that there are no food supplies maintained at the hub (St Aidans on the hill). It is up to us as a community to coordinate the days or weeks following a disaster when we cannot get down to the valley.

Are you prepared for up to ten days after an emergency event? Do you have a plan in place in the event that the roads are blocked off, or that your access to crucial resources are cut off? NOW IS THE TIME TO GET PREPARED.
