## Beware the Rats



A reader sent us the following story:

Recently there was a rat tail showing in my toilet (body obviously in the pipe bend). **HELP!**

I flushed furiously and between flushes no rat tail to be seen BUT I could hear scabbling noises. So I turned to the internet. "Pour bleach (I used Janola) and close the lid. The rat will die of asphyxiation within 15 minutes." No more sign of or sounds from the rat.

"Rats can enter your house through the plumbing pipes and then up through your toilet bowl." I was lucky it was partially in the pipe as they are more likely to jump out if in the bowl. It would have been an even bigger **HELP!**

This year I understand there is an influx of rats and we good people of NZ are aiming to be predator free. So make the effort to get rid of these undesirable creatures by getting traps and laying poison baits. I have a rat trap sourced from a local resident and am occasionally catching rats. I am about to start using poison stations.

Another local resident told us a rat had chewed through a crucial part of his dishwasher.

Predator Free Normandale (PFN) was started about 18 months ago with Stuart Reid calling a public meeting. From there they now have 54 members and over 300 fewer rats. If you are interested in joining PFN or are already trapping or baiting, let them know so they can build a map of all our community trapping stations and help you along the way.


