Since installation over a month ago, the new playground at Normandale Playcentre is enjoyed by children in a variety of different ways. Children have sold vanilla and chocolate ice creams from the "shop", escaped on a rocket to the moon and had races down the double slide. There have been scrambles through the tunnel and the clang clang of the bell of the fire engine.

The fun now enjoyed from the new playground has been a culmination of a massive effort – over four years of group meetings, ideas and brainstorming, fundraising ventures, grant applications and the vetting and engagement of a supplier. The playground was installed in two phases – with the second stage of the playground installation taking place on the 31st July. The new structure enhances our already fantastic natural outdoor play area.

Minoh House Cherry Blossom Festival


