The signs are located at the site of the horse trough near the junction with Miromiro Road, the old boundary between Hutt City and Hutt County above the junction with Pekanga Road, opposite the entrance to the old Normandale school at the junction with Poto Road and half way between the junction with Cottle Park Drive and that with the link to Sweetacres Drive. The NRA would like to acknowledge the assistance of Hutt City Council in developing and erecting these signs through the Community engagement fund, and especially the help of Nigel Parkin from the Roads and Traffic Division.
