



#### Tradescantia-fluminensis – Wandering Willie

Your Normandale Residents' Association are thinking of planting some natives over the next few years at the bottom of Normandale hill. The area is currently quite heavily covered in Tradescantia and we would like to promote the removal of this weed from Normandale. Going by the common name, Wandering Willie, Tradescantia-fluminensis is particularly good at establishing itself and spreading.

Why is it considered a weed? Tradescantia forms a mat which smothers the ground and prevents the seedlings of native species from establishing. It particularly likes shady spots but is intolerant of frost and drought.

How does it spread? It only needs a small part of the stem to start a new plant. Stem fragments are spread by water movement, livestock, dumped vegetation, soil movement, boots and mowers.

We recommend that you take a look at www.weedbusters.org.nz/ It has lots of useful and specific information on the removal and safe disposal of Tradescantia. We at the Normandale Resident's Association would like to reduce the size of the area

which tradescantia inhabits and you can all play a part in reducing it. It reportedly makes good chcken food and can be turned to compost if left in a light proof bag (a lengthy proccess of up to 3 years). Lastly be carefull when doing anything with it as dropped fragments can spread the infestation!

### Teddy Bear Picnic


