Whaitiri illustrated his talk with a power point show.

He mentioned that each Team consisted of eight members, they all trained in various aspects of search and rescue including crowd control, communications reporting, evacuation and welfare, safety and much more. The training was in line with others within NZ and overseas so Teams could be readily assimilated - or exchanged for relief work - where required.

HCC, Police, Fire Department, and Wellington Emergency Management Office all called on them for help. The members were reliable and made themselves available as much as possible. They were all volunteers.

Whaitiri explained that for him the Christchurch earthquake had provided valuable experience. Following several questions Whaitiri was thanked for his talk.

We all had supper and a chat. The dishes were done as the room was cleared.
