Inorganic collection restrictions

- No garden or household refuse
- No tyres or glass
- No paint (water or oil based)
- No recyclable material (things that you would usually put in your recycling bin)
- No hazardous material particularly no medical waste
- No commercial or excessive quantities of building and other waste.

Denika Mead is a 15 year old Normandale Resident and she has just published her first novel, Royal Orchid the Death-Hunters!





Civil Defence in Normandale-Get prepared!

Hello New Residents (and those who have been here a while): This is your yearly reminder about being prepared for a civil defence emergency in Normandale!.

Key Information

- Our local Civil Defence centre is located at St Aidans Church. There is a small kit located here, that is provided by WREMO. It only includes the bare essentials for communication and organisation.
- The civil defence kit **DOES NOT contain any food and water.** You should be prepared to sustain you and your family from your own stores of food and water for at least 10 days.
- Make sure that you have at least 10 days worth of essential medications at all times.
- In the event of an emergency we are likely to be cut off from the valley floor or very likely to have more people coming up to the hill to escape a tsunami. We may need to even feed and water our neighbours from the valley. So be prepared for the idea that we may not have access back down the hills due to traffic. Also emergency services may be unable to reach us.
- There are no paid civil defence staff to run our local centre in the event of an emergency. We will need to do this ourselves as a community. While we as your committee have every intent to go to the centre to try and help anyone who needs it, we ourselves may be cut off from either Normandale or getting to the centre. So those who are here will all need to work together as a community.
