

# 1950s community leader Pete Charman passes

We are sad to say that long time community member Pete Charman, has died in Cambridge at the age of 93.

While he was living in Normandale, Pete bought a movie camera and with a group of enthusiasts they began making short films.

Pete used his movie camera to film local activities including the Scout hall opening, Scouts camping in Stratton Street, Father's Day at the new Normandale Playcentre, and the amalgamation wire cutting.

In 2007 he returned to Normandale for the wire cutting re-enactment and ended up filming it. Many of the participants were children of those who had played important roles back in 1957.

Known as "Pothole Pete" he also wrote for the Normandale Times, and was chairman of the local Scouts committee which built the Scout hall (now a karate dojo) in Wilson Grove.

Pete lived an active life until the end, and is survived by first wife Joan, second wife Daphne and his children, grandchildren and great-grandchildren.
