

Wellington Transport Plans now open for consultation

Wondering what's going on with the Melling interchange, or at the bottom of Normandale bridge? Do you have some thoughts about Snapper vs train tickets? The Greater Wellington Regional Council wants to hear from you!

Consultation on both the draft Wellington Regional Land Transport Plan 2021 and draft Regional Public Transport Plan opened on the 15th February, and will be running through to the 19th March 2021.

Hutt City Council are also planning development of their <u>Integrated Transport Strategy</u>. The public is also invited to participate in the strategy's development, with further workshops with key stakeholders also on the cards. Kiwi wines for the tasting

New Zealand wines, some from boutique vineyards, will dominate the year's programme at the Western Hills Wine Society.

Presenters will include Pisa Range Estate from Central Otago (April), Te Mata Estate from the Hawke's Bay (May), Porters Pinot of Martinborough, Hawke's Ridge and Moana Park Estate from the Hawke's Bay, and Mt Rosa from Queenstown's Gibbston Valley.

The society aims to give locals an introduction to New Zealand and overseas wines in a friendly and fun environment; meeting in the Maungaraki Community Centre supper room on the first Wednesday of every month, running from 7:30-8pm.



The wine society meetings are covered by a liquor licence and a set measure used which limits the overall amount a person can drink. Visitors 18 and over always welcome. Admission is \$15 per person.
