

Road Safety in Normandale

A resident has gotten in touch concerned about the road safety in Normandale, having seen an increase in the number of cars driving down the centre of the road.

The Road Code is very clear on this- if a driver crosses a marked centre line they must do so safely. Cars travelling in the opposite direction on the other side of the road have automatic right-ofway, and the driver crossing the centre line will be responsible for any collision.

This casual attitude of driving down the road centre line is particularly dangerous here in Normandale with our multitude of windy roads and blind spots. Please especially think about our bike riding whanau when on the road up here on the Hills, it can *"literally be a case of life and death"*, as this resident emailed to us.

Inorganic Rubbish Collection 2021

Early on Saturday morning 8th May, two very large rubbish skips were deposited onto a vacated part of Normandale Road. One skip was reserved for items which could be used by a local metal recycling company and the other was reserved for general rubbish destined for the tip.

This annual collection service was provided free of charge to NRA members, and those arriving with rubbish who were not paid up members were encouraged to pay their five dollar annual subscription on the spot.

During the day there was a steady stream of vehicles stopping off at the skips to off load rubbish and some residents managed multiple trips. Notable objects collected included: microwave ovens, filing cabinets, car radiators, consumer electronics, building waste material, furniture and mattresses. Thanks to everyone who made the trip, it shows to the organisers the collection is worth doing. Special thanks go to all the volunteers who helped on the day with loading items into the bins, your hard work is very much appreciated.
