

Predator Free Normandale is continuing their activities this year, supplying information and motivation to rid the suburb of pests and to make it a better habitat for Normandale's native flora and fauna. A summary of their catches for the 2022 period is above and include: 21 Hedgehogs, 327 mice, 3 possum, 453 rats, 3 stoats, 1 weasel and 4 unspecified; with a total of 812 pests caught.

Recently this year a weasel and a stoat were caught at the bottom of the hill and there have also been recent sightings of stoats in rural areas, so Predator Free activity is ongoing.







Become a committee member!


