
Flowering Cherry Trees and Sycamore Trees – Pretty but INVASIVE!

Right now cherry seeds, spread by birds eating the fruits, are starting to sprout everywhere. They are often found in suburban gardens, paddocks, in grassy scrubby areas and popping up between pavers and in cracks.

If you haven't purposefully planted these in your garden, you may want to consider pulling them out before they sprout significantly. Once they get bigger they are very hard to remove and as an invasive species, grow very fast and stifle the native bush. Sycamore trees are another invasive species and those seedlings are also just starting to sprout. The following pictures show what the seedlings look like.

Maungaraki Tennis 50th Jubilee


