## Normandale paths, tracks, and shortcuts- Gaskill Track



Gaskill track enables you to walk from Melling Railway station to Minoh House, via the bush in Jubilee Park.

The route starts on a footpath directly opposite the Melling Railway station, which heads uphill and connects to Jenness Grove, in Habourview. It continues uphill via Gaskill Grove, at the end of which there is an entrance to Jubilee Park. The Jubilee Park track traverses the lower portion of Jubilee Park, through secondary growth and some native bush and the flat grassy sites of former significant colonial homes which were demolished prior to the motorway being widened from two to four lanes. There is also a wooden board walk and some well formed steps. It links up with other tracks which give access to Minoh House.

The walk duration is approximately 30 minutes uphill through the bush. Parts of the route can be wet and muddy during the winter period, but still well worth walking.
