Update- Melling line investment by Govt.

Transport Minister Simeon Brown outlined the Government's investment in Wellington's metro rail network.

A total of \$52.9 million has been allocated to fulfill a backlog of maintenance across the Johnsonville, Kapiti and Hutt Valley lines, as well as some work on the Melling and Wairararapa lines. Of relevance for Normandale is the re-laying of around 800 metres of track on the Melling Line so it can continue to operate into the future. This funding comes in alongside the Wellington Metro Upgrade Programme, which is pumping \$870 million into track renewal work across the Wellington Region.

Government also recently confirmed significant funding for Greater Wellington Regional Council to purchase new trains and for KiwiRail to make associated track improvements.
