## Normandale Santa Parade 2024

For the last 40 years Santa has visited Normandale on Christmas morning. He'll be here again this year for visit number 41, spreading his special brand of joy to residents of all ages as he travels our suburb in his sleigh. The parade is a highlight on the local calendar since it began on Christmas Day 1984 under the auspices of the residents' association.

Santa's parade begins at 10am on the corner of Poto Road and Stratton Street.

The route is Stratton Street, Cottle Park Drive, down Normandale Road, Poto Road, Pokohiwi Road, Eastview Grove, Pekanga Road, Taka Grove, Christina Grove, up Normandale Road, Poto Road to Wilson and Martin Groves, down Miromiro Road and up Normandale Road where he will visit Pae Ariki Place for the first time and finish at Pekanga Road soon after 11am.

A car with a siren will herald Santa's approach. Santa will deliver presents while his helpers throw sweets donated by the Normandale Residents' Association to those waiting near their mailboxes to greet him.

## **Inorganic Collection Day 2024**

Inorganic Collection Day 2024 proved to be a Goldilocks day- not too hot and not too cold. The rubbish collected didn't fall into specific categories, there was 'not too much' of anything, whereas in previous years there has been a predominance of one type of rubbish or another. Another obvious difference was the lack of white-ware, or large loads.

It was a slow start and by 11am we were wondering if perhaps we didn't need the collection, but from then on we had a steady flow of cars and people on foot, one of whom reminded us that we had been competing with the All Blacks vs Ireland match.

The bin reserved for recyclable metal was not overly utilised, being less than a quarter full at the end of the day. The general rubbish bin was approximately 80% full when we closed up at 4pm. It was once again disappointing that there was rubbish dumped before we arrived at 8:20, (pictured right) and more in the evening after we closed. This was observed by residents in neighbouring houses, perhaps it was non Normandale residents, but if not please ensure you pay your association sub.

I would like to thank the committee members who did a great job manning (and wommaning) the rubbish collection, some of whom were there most of the day. And a special thanks to the 4 community volunteers who also spent several hours helping.
