#### Matariki

Matariki is the Māori name for the cluster of stars also known as the Pleiades, Seven Sisters, or for the Japanese, Subaru. As Matariki follows the Māori lunar calendar the dates for it change every year- this year it's from 19-22 June, and the <u>public holiday</u> for it is <u>Friday 20th June 2025</u>. This leads into the winter solstice (shortest day of the year) on Saturday 21st June.

Marking the start of a new year for Māori, many across Aotearoa take part in events that honour the principles of Matariki. These are:

Matariki Hunga Nui- Remembrance: Honouring those we have lost during the past year.

Matariki Ahunga Nui- Celebrating the Present: Coming together to give thanks for what we have. Often this is through a meal, sharing what's been harvested with friends and family.

Matariki Manako Nui- Looking to the Future: Looking ahead to the promise of a new year.

Between Budget announcements, cost of living pressures, and global events, one may struggle to keep trucking along- but we have! 

# Presidents report 2024/5

Your committee has had a productive year with two projects dominating.

Following from the concerns raised over Jubilee Park pond at last years AGM, we have spent some time trying to get to the bottom of who does what. Ivan has been assiduous in keeping an eye on what has, or has not, happened whilst I have been untangling the labyrinthine web of responsibility between HCC (asset owner), GW (regulatory body) and Wellington Water (consent applicant). I'm happy to report that whilst not completely restored, lorry loads of silt have now been removed and about half the pond is back to its original state.

The other major project has been the garden at the corner of Normandale and Miromiro Roads. Sandie has led a small but dedicated group, weeding, planting and general tidying up. There is now a good display of leptospermum, hebe and coprosma shrubs well mulched and bedded down for the winter months. The appreciative comments of passers by when we have been working are particularly pleasing.

Through the Normandale Times we have helped publicise local community initiatives such as a muti-generational project to help dogs and dog owners, and student cultural exchanges.

We continue to support the Normandale Santa Parade with donations of sweets. This years inorganic rubbish collection was blessed with good weather, although the amount of rubbish collected was a far cry from the days when we would fill four or five lorry loads; perhaps a sign of a welcome trend away from a throw away society.

Your committee made a submission on the HCC representation review, and I spoke in support to the Commission.

I also represented the NRA at meetings with HCC on improving community engagement, developing the city centre, and the long term vision for Lower Hutt / Te Awa Kairangi ki Tai.

My thanks to your committee for their support over the last year, and to you all for allowing me to serve as your president.

On behalf of the committee I would also like to thank Chrissy of CK & Co for their continuing support in printing the Normandale Times.
