

Local body election results

The final results for the Hutt City Council elections (as relevant to Normandale) are as follows. Also included are the elected representatives for the Te Awa Kairangi ki Tai Lower Hutt General Constituency on Greater Wellington Regional Council, and the results of the two referendums.

Overall the voter turnout for Hutt City was 41.56% (33,038 votes, including special votes).

Amalgamation Poll

YES 17,429 NO 14,283

The majority of Hutt City electors voted in favour of the Amalgamation Poll – Hutt City Council. Poll results are non-binding and Hutt City Council will use the poll outcome as part of its future policy direction on amalgamation.

To note-Porirua residents also voted in favor of a proposed amalgamation between Hutt City Council, Porirua Council, and Wellington Council.

Electricity outages

Following on from three power outages in three days this month - about six hours over two outages on Tuesday 21st and another six hours on Thursday 23rd, we checked with the lines company, Wellington Electricity, to see if there was anything that we should be following up on your behalf. Not surprisingly the answer was that there was no structural problem, just the usual problems in high wind events: lines clashing and damage from falling trees and branches.

Because Normandale is an older suburb, all our lines are overhead so we are more vulnerable to these, and because we are on the edge of the city, there are more long 'tails' on our lines, and these tails tend to be the last to have power restored. For example, we are literally at the end of one line, and our power came back about two hours after the rest of Normandale. I'm sure there are other points in our local network that are in the same position.

What can be done about it? Well, the obvious answer would be to put the lines underground, but there is one little problem there, it would cost us all an awful lot in targeted line charges over many years, and I can't see many people queuing up to pay. It would actually be cheaper for us to install back up batteries!

When a similar situation arose a couple of years ago we arranged for Wellington Electricity to give us a presentation on the problems and what could be done, and I would be happy to send a copy of this to anyone interested.


