

42nd Normandale Santa Parade

Most things we are involved in, as is usual in community work, are either long term advocacy or tasks that never actually end. Most obvious of these is the garden at the junction with Miromiro Road where our plants are doing well, but the weeds grow even faster! This year though there were two projects we supported and have been completed, we purchased and installed a solar powered light for St Aidan's; and made a donation to support Normandale School's flying fox. We also continued the tradition of funding sweets for the Santa parade. Although we didn't have an inorganic rubbish collection this year, we promoted the recycling weekend.

In our advocacy role we had some success in reminding Wellington Water of the need to complete the dredging of the Jubilee Park pond, and HCC of potholes in roads and paths.

The highlight of the year however was probably the 'Meet the candidates' meeting with Mayoral, HCC Council and GW Council hopefuls all turning up to address a packed hall. We received several compliments from candidates on the way it was run, who also noted that it was the best attended of such meetings across the City.

John Dobson commemorative seat



Recently a commemorative seat (pictured above) has been installed on Miromiro Road, close to the entrance to St. Johns Way and the top of the '100 Steps'. The seat commemorates the life of John Warwick James Dobson, who passed away on 30th June 2025, aged 87.

Dobbie, as he was known to his friends, neighbours and acquaintances, lived most of his life in Normandale and was instrumental in developing St. Johns Way for residential housing. This included moving the position of the original house in the area. His passion for the development of St Johns Way spanned decades and continued well into old age.

As a young man Dobbie was a plumbing apprentice, and these skills were gratefully appreciated by locals. His other passions included his family, travelling, entrepreneurship, and the Petone Rugby Club.
