SuperCity 🖓

You can't have failed to notice the flurry of publicity regarding regional governance following the publication of the Local Government Commission's (LGC) report and preferred option for a single unitary council covering the region, the option

commonly referred to as 'Supercity'. The debate in the local press ranges from reasoned to acrimonious with entrenched views seeming to dominate over any factual analysis.

The NRA's position has always been determined by you, our members, as expressed at the various meetings held since the subject was raised. This is currently to oppose the proposed change and advocate for the current system, based on the loss of local democracy, and a lack of any evidence that similar amalgamations elsewhere have led to any improvement in services, or cost savings. A position confirmed by the recent HCC poll of residents throughout the city where 76% of residents in the Western ward opposed amalgamation. Having read the LGC's report I have found nothing in the evidence presented that would warrants a change to our current position. Currently the proposal is open for submission and we will be making a submission to support our view.

As you will be aware, the proposal is also open to a poll, the result of which will determine the outcome by a simple majority. The NRA will be holding a public meeting to discuss these matters once we get to that stage, and in the interim, we are happy to discuss the issue and provide any information required to anyone interested, or who would like to put in a submission on their own behalf.
