
The next NRA meeting will be held at St Aidans church on Wednesday 20th of July - all association members welcome. The meetings last from 7:30 until 9:00.


A sausage sizzle was fired up and activities were scattered around the school such as: star gazing, fish book mark making, colouring in, Matariki stories and film in the school library.
