
Please put your items out by 9am on the 12th at the latest to ensure they are collected. We will also have a collection bin at 145 Normandale Road for any items you forget to put out on time!

You'll have seen the big slips that came down during the weekend of 16th to 18th of September, 2016. It was a pretty wet weekend. According to the metservice, (see metservice.com/towns-cities/wellington/lower-hutt) in Lower Hutt we had **30.4** mm, 27.8 mm, and **31.4** mm respectively on the 16th, 17th, and 18th of September - a total of nearly **90** mm over 3 days. This is much higher rainfall than our historical average for the whole month of September of **40** mm (myweather2.com)

As a hilly suburb we should watch out for slips and drive and cycle carefully, especially after days of heavy rain like we had in the middle of September.


