Normandale Landslips

In September Grant Roberts kindly provided these images of landslides around Normandale brought on by the rain at that time.

These photos are taken near the bottom of Normandale road, where a clean up operation (by Dews Construction Ltd) was in progress. Grant Roberts told me that since the construction of the road, the bank was almost constantly having slips and landslides.



The slip scarp extended the full height of the hillside and covered half the road with debris. Luckily workers arrived shortly after the slip and, with rocks still sliding down the hill, cleared it.

They have planted hydroseed (grass) on the slopes, hoping for a temporary fix to the problem until more work can (hopefully) be done to protect the cliff from erosion.
